2. Despite that, people were still pursuing a longer existence, driven by fear of death and a hope that they will one day find an ever lost immortality.



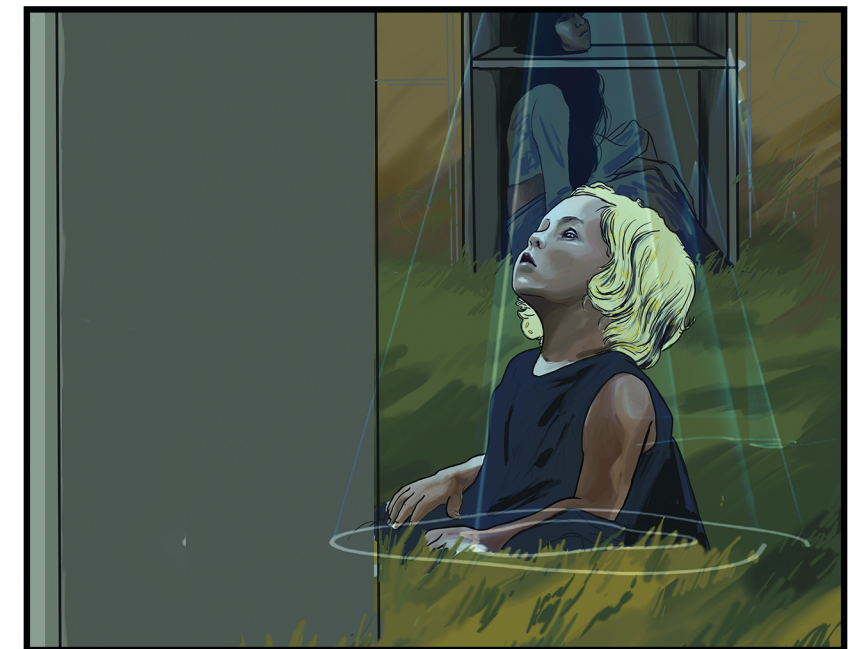
3. Death was an ever present figure in a world with no more space, yet humanity learned to ignore both him and all of his subjects.
