

TOPIC SENSE PERCEPTION





• Munker White-Illusion

The experiment shows that sight influences our beliefs.



HOW DO SENSE PERCEPTION AND REASON DETERMINE BELIEFS?

• Religion

The existence of Jesus in *Animism* religion.

People following Animism believe in what they see (animals, plants, and inanimate objects), and they don't believe in Jesus, since they've never seen him.

- In what other ways are our beliefs manipulated by other factors other than sense perception? Like social conformity, maybe?



HOW DO SENSE PERCEPTION AND REASON DETERMINE BELIEFS?


- Visual portrayal in Studio
- Present a piece of work that tricks the mind into thinking it is real, when, in reality, it is not
- Create performance in which the audience is involved
- The audience would be doing something, not knowing why and would after realise it wasn't 'real'


• How is the same source of a texture or material different in different cultures due to its treatment or atmosphere?

HOW ARE TEXTURES PRODUCED IN DIFFERENT COUNTRIES?


• Visual portrayal in Studio


- Present a series of canvases, each holding a certain type of material (for example, leather)

- Artist Chris Jordan uses texture and material to create artistic pieces






HOW ARE TEXTURES USED TO MAKE ART?


