# **Read 9 Ways to Think More Obliquely and Develop Your Ideas**

**Based upon what you saw and heard from our class** go back and explore your ideas more deeply or if you have a better idea develop it for class and peer review.

- 1. For inspiration review, your entries in the exploring <u>Exploring your interests</u> worksheet.
- Narrow your ideas to at least two distinct ideas. Use the <u>Problem Definition</u> Worksheet to frame your ideas and submit them to Canvas.
- 3. Do a little (more) research on each topic to begin to build a deeper understanding.

### Create up to to 3 slides for each topic

### Slide 1: Frame the topic

This can be an inspirational image to visually represent your topic.

Reflect on why you find this interesting, share any anecdotes, experiences, personal connections, or motivations that are related to the topic.

### Slide 2: New information and facts

- 1. Go deeper into your topic and explain why it is worthy of a deeper dive.
- 2. Why should we care? Explain the personal connection you make and how it relates to your colleagues.
- 3. Include some historical context looking back on the history related to your topic or problem.
- 4. Reframe the problem from a different perspective.

### Slide 3: Reflect

- 1. How have your ideas evolved since our last class Sept 10th?
- 2. Questions for the class to add depth and dimension to your next steps.

Save your slides as a PDF in a widescreen format  $-1080 \ge 1920$ . Upload this PDF to Canvas prior to the start of class. **OR** Consider recording a narrative over your slides and save it as a movie.

Tools for this include <u>Screencast-o-Matic</u> or similar. If you do this submit a link to the movie.instead of a pdf.

Be prepared to present in class – each person will have 5 minutes to present their topics with brief feedback from the class.
