Plagiarism

"The practice of taking someone else's work or ideas and passing them off as one's own."


Copyright Infringement

"The unauthorized or unlicensed copying of a work subject to copyright."

Imitation

"A thing intended to simulate or copy something else."

Types of Plagiarism



Direct

using word-for-word work by someone else, claiming it as your own

Hired

if someone pays another person to write their assignment for them

Borrowed

using essays from friends

Self-Plagiarism

using an assignment that you have already submitted for another class or directly copying it

Mosaic

adding parts of your work and someone else's in one assignment

Collaboration

if you work with others on a project but claim it was done alone

Contributing Author

if someone contributes to an essay and you do not credit them

Aggregated

using someone else's idea and sources as another paper

Outline

using the same basic points of another paper with new information

Bibliography

directly copying someone else's bibliography in your own work

Secondary Source


citing primary sources correctly but not secondary sources

Accidental

if you read research or language that influences your writing and inadvertently use similar phrases in your work

Turnitin

Could avoid writing papers if they simply copied off the internet

Turnitin was developed in 2000 and became a staple in schools and universities

Compare students' work to stored essays and sources

ArXiv

Publication focused on physics

TrackBacks protocol

- Only those qualified can post
- Anyone can read, anonymous sites not allowed

However, some well-known journals currently refuse to publish a paper if on an open-access platform

American Historical Association


1974 committee of representatives, elected by the members

- Addressed concerns of ethical misconduct in academia
- Published new guidelines that enforced a confidential procedure

Raised concerns about lawsuits and whether the division was effective and legitimate, instead educate the public and historians about plagiarism

University Regulations

Their policy states that "through syllabi, or in assignments, faculty members are responsible for informing students of policies with respect to the limits within which they may collaborate with, or seek help from, others. [...] The New School recognizes that the different nature of work across the schools of the University may require different procedures for citing sources and referring to the work of others. [...] This policy is not intended to interfere with the exercise of academic freedom and artistic expression."

Step 1: Faculty would notify the student involved Step 2: Faculty meets with the student Step 3:

review the faculty's

The student also has
the right to appeal
in writing within
fifteen days

Trademark

"A word, name, symbol, or device used to indicate the source, quality, and ownership of a product or service."

Defining characteristic from one person or brand to another

Valid registration lasts for ten years and must be renewed to be in continued use

Patent

"A grant from the U.S. government that permits its owner to prevent others from making, using, and importing, or selling an invention."

Three types:

- Utility
- Design
- Plant patents

Considered trade secrets

Non-Disclosure Agreement

Non Disclosure Agreement

properties that may be considered confidential. Therefore, the Parties are in agreement to the following terms and

"Typically used whenever there is transfer of private or confidential information from one organization to another."

Legally binding contracts

Extremely common document not limited to the area of design

Protection of proprietary information, invasion of privacy, responsibility of violation

Creative Commons License

Most recent development in intellectual property

- Developed in 2002
- Current version in 2013

"Simple, standardized way to grant copyright permissions to their creative work."

Case Study Examples





AP Photographer Mannie Garcia v. Shephard Fairey's Obama campaign poster

- 2008
- Later discovered that Fairey misled the court about what photo the poster was based on by submitting false evidence
- Prompted his attorneys to withdraw
- No decisive decision made
- Questions around the photograph being fair use
- Was Fairey's work derivative or transformative?

Case Study Examples



Dave Warren, the Creative Director of Fly Communications c.2010 v. Thomas Porostocky of No Labels c.2004

- Warren claims that he created the concept and the graphic was based on royalty free clip art
- Disputed this, by saying that it was blatant plagiarism

Conclusion

My Recommendations

1 Overall: Better understanding for intermediary design steps

University: If you partner with a company or share your work with peers for feedback, plagiarism can overshadow the capstone projects which are integral to the learning experience

Workplace: Can work within parameters of an NDA but issue being that more companies move in-house after round 1 consultation (most important) and becomes a grey area if a team can use the project in their portfolio. Is it possible to have a combined effort and collaboration between the agency and brand that is legally viable?

Future Expectations

More development and ethics taught in combating plagiarism

More information available and in niche industries instead of thought about in one way

Technology to combat plagiarism will have to evolve alongside the innovation that warrants it

We have better technology everyday at our disposal

Develop into various methods that will be more specific to different types of work

Understand the nuances of the subject, which will ultimately fall onto the universities

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
